**Cllr Edgell** reported that the TAP fund (now called Communities together) has funding available – we do not have a joint project, but Cllr Wadsworth will work up an application for the redevelopment of the Old Orchard into a dogwalking/leisure area, There was a discussion about womens and walking football as the Glebe Field Committee is interested in promoting these sports, and this could possibly be extended to include the Landkey residents.

Cllr Knill suggested that for the time being it is fenced off so that the work can continue on the orchard plans. It was suggested that Cllrs Skinner, Wadsworth, Knill and Morrish will make a site visit to judge the length of time and the cost of tidying up the area, This was proposed and seconded – All in favour.
